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Directions from **Ko'Olina / Waianae** to North Shore and Dillingham Airfield

The *overview* of these directions is:

H-1 to Hwy 750 to Hwy 99/803 to Hwy 930 to Waialua/Mokuleia (Dillingham Airfield)

** Approximate drive-time = 40 minutes ** (25 miles)

Get on the H-1 Freeway EAST-bound.

Continue on H-1 East - past Campbell Industrial, past Makakilo/Kapolei, to Kunia Rd (EXIT 5).

Get OFF the H-1 at Kunia Rd (Exit 5).

At the end of the freeway off-ramp <u>turn LEFT</u> at the traffic light . You will then be on Hwy 750 North (Kunia Rd).

Distance from the freeway off-ramp to the end of Hwy 750 is about 8 miles, where it intersects Hwy 99.

<u>Hwy 750 North</u> (Kunia Rd) intersects Hwy 99 at a T-intersection with a traffic signal (Schofield Barracks area). <u>Turn LEFT</u> onto Hwy 99, and proceed through 3 more traffic signals.

Just before Traffic Signal #3, there is a FORK in the road, and there are 3 or 4 ROAD-SIGNS giving the choices: Hwy 99, North Shore, Haleiwa, Dillingham Airfield.

So continue THRU Traffic Light #3, and you are on the road to Dillingham Airfield.

If you were looking at a map, the next 6 miles after Traffic Light #3 is designated as $\underline{\text{Hwy 803}}$; (but there are $\underline{\text{NO}}$ '803' signs posted); [don't worry] ...

Hwy 803 is a 6-mile stretch of road; 3 miles of straight; 3 miles of "windy" down-the-hill.

At the beginning of the windy-road, you are at 500-ft elevation and at the base of the hill, you are at 20-foot elevation. As you decend the hill, you will be able to see the North Shore coast-line, and off to your LEFT will be the Waianae Mountain Range. Unless visibility is limited by cloud-cover or haze, you will be able to see we

visibility is limited by cloud-cover or haze, you will be able to see where the mountain tapers-off.

That is about the location of <u>Dillingham Airfield</u>, on the way to the northwestern tip of the island, <u>Kaena Point</u>.

At the base of the HILL is an Intersection 4-WAY STOP, red blinker-light;

This is the intersection of Hwy 803 and Hwy 930.

GO STRAIGHT THRU the intersection;

You are now on Hwy 930.

Just for your information, <u>Hwy 930</u> starts at the TRAFFIC-CIRCLE at <u>Haleiwa</u> (about 1 mile away), and makes a 90-degree turn at the blinker-light INTERSECTION, and continues out towards <u>Dillingham Airfield</u> and <u>Kaena Point</u>.

FROM THE BLINKER-LIGHT INTERSECTION, continue ahead for about 1 mile.

You will see a ROAD-SIGN for

MOKULEIA and DILLINGHAM AIRFIELD

These signs point towards the underpass of a bridge; ... go under the bridge.

You are still on Hwy 930 (Farrington Hwy), ...continue ...

A half-block beyond the bridge, and on your left, is Waialua Intermediate & High School.

Continue about another 5 miles to the Airfield.

<u>Dillingham Airfield</u> is a 2-mile-long airstrip, parallel to the highway, with a green chain-link perimeter fence-line. There are 3 entrances to the Airfield. Entrance #1 is for the SKYDIVE activities (and the interior service-road for the airfield). Entrance #2 is 1.5 miles further, and THAT is the <u>Glider-port</u> entrance.

AsyouentertheGLIDER-PORTparkinglot, there is an OPEN-SIDED SHELTER-BUILDING straight-ahead. This is the RECEPTION area. Ask for <u>Honolulu Soaring</u> / <u>The Original Glider Rides</u>, and <u>check in with "Mr. Bill"</u>.
